Gippsland Lakes Environment Report 2021

Summary







The Gippsland Lakes are important to the Gippsland community and support important cultural, social, environmental and economic values. Most of the Gippsland Lakes system has international recognition as a Wetland of International Importance through the Ramsar Convention. Information on the health of the Lakes is constantly being gathered and updated. From time to time this monitoring information is compiled to report on the condition of the lakes, evaluate the status of monitoring programs and identify areas for improvement.

This Gippsland Lakes Environment Report assesses the current condition of the Lakes based on most recent available data. It also highlights some key knowledge gaps and importantly establishes a framework for future condition assessments.

Recognising the importance of the Lakes to the community, the Victorian Government invested \$12.5m for the period 2015 -2020 to protect and improve the ecological and community values supported by the Lakes. This builds on significant, ongoing government investment since 1998. In 2021 the Victorian government committed an additional \$7.5 million over three years to implement projects to improve the health of the Gippsland Lakes.

The task to maintain the health of the Gippsland Lakes requires a long term commitment by government in partnership with the community and other organisations and groups. A robust approach is currently in place to manage and improve our understanding of the lakes including:

- coordinated management through the Gippsland Lakes Coordinating Committee and Ramsar site coordination;
- strategic planning through the Gippsland Lakes Ramsar Site Management Plan and the Gippsland Lakes Priorities Plan;
- working collaboratively with Traditional Owners and other land and waterway managers to deliver priority projects across the Lakes;
- regular monitoring of the Lakes and values of the Ramsar site;
- partnering with the community to deliver projects on the ground;
- · improving knowledge through learning as we go;
- sharing information through the Love our Lakes website and other forums.


Status
